VIII. Treasurer's Report – Janine Bruhn

Janine presented the following report:

Treasurer activities since last report:

- The annual tax preparation for the PTSA and ANG accounts was completed by the accounting firm Turner, Leins & Gold LLC November 1st
 - Forms were sent to the IRS for processing on Nov 4th
- Completed the required third-party reconciliation of the PTSA financial records for the month of September (by Monica Cramer)
- VA PTSA compliance documentation updated for 2021-2022:
 - Submission/payment of monthly membership September
 - 72 members were added for a total 426 as of Sept 30th
 - Uploaded the 2021 tax documentation on Nov 4th
 - Submitted the PTSA Local Unit Organizational Structure form reflecting Ms. Elizabeth Calvert as principal and Dr. Michelle Reid as Superintendent on Nov 8

Overall financial status through October 2022 (as reflected in the PTSA budget hand out):

- PTSA total income: \$20,191
- PTSA total expenses: \$5,412
- ANG total income: \$3,859
- No ANG expenses to report to date

Budget fitness as of October 2022:

- Net membership income is just shy of the 2022-2023 budget goal of \$7,700 (income is \$6,792 with 458 members as of Oct 31).
- PTSA donations have exceeded the 2022-2023 budget goal of \$7,500 with \$10,181 total to date.
- Academic Booster donations have exceeded the 2022-2023 budget goal of \$2,000 with \$2,748 total to date.
