- I. Call to Order and Welcome Regan Morgan
- II. Approval of August 29 PTSA Minutes Reagan Morgan

Regan announced that the Aug 29<sup>th</sup> meeting minutes have been posted to the PTSA website.

Sarah Lundquist moved to approve the minutes as presented. A vote was taken and the motion passed to approve the Aug 29 minutes. Regan announced that the vote passed by majority vote and is adopted.

### III. Principal's Report – Liz Calvert

A massive thank you to parents for the Homecoming activities. It was an amazing event. Thank you for smoothies they were a Huge hit and the teachers loved them.

Stated that the staff and students are getting into the rhythm of things now at this point in the year.

Update Structure Professional Development – 3 buckets of focus. What it means and normalize your grades- having consistency between teachers. Next month - feedback to the students for moving forward with this grading structure. This semester intro to new grade format. Then in February we will restart the process.

Next year focus on consistency especially for the seniors.

The Belonging work is still in progress. We still need parents to volunteer. We will put out a message soon. How it will look and the needs identified. Will lay out if we need more data or we can start planning. It will start being put together – please Email Principal Calvert if you know of anyone interested in getting involved.

Another communication will be coming out about cell phone usage in school. Students have been observed using their phones / watches during class. Teachers have been noticing students looking at watches/ phones etc during instruction time. We will send a message to the students but are also asking for parents help in discussing at home.

There is a school mode and directions will go out to families to enact.

The last couple of years have been emotional and difficult for people coming out of the pandemic. The energy this year is feeling more energetic and different. We are happy to see it. The development of middle school kids is SOOO important to Freshman entering high school and this year it has been noticed.

The current Senior class and SGA are tremendous.

There are so many groups from Madison on Instagram. You can follow all of them.

Angela: question: How the arrest of the coach has impacted the teachers and students, How are they reacting. Calvert response: The investigation started in the summer. Some families were already aware of something happening. It is important to know that no student was harmed. It was a good person who made a bad mistake, but the law is the law and there are consequences.

Mr. Buckley: Mr. Kenny and I met with the team and everyone in the program. We had a face-to-face discussion with everyone. They joined together as a unit and the athletes have the support of the counselors, Buckley and Mr. Kenny if needed. Resources were made available to them if wanted or needed to discuss.

Calvert: The whole community has pulled together to deal with it. Rules have to be followed, so it was reported and everyone is moving on. We are monitoring the adults and the kids.

### IV. Student Services Report – Tim Buckley

Tomorrow is Senior SAT and Junior and Sophomore pre-sat. If the students plan to take the test, they would have had to sign up already. Junior and Sophomores come in and take the pre-sats. There will be 1100 digital Sat tests administered tomorrow.... we are a little nervous! Jen F. has done absolutely an amazing job putting this all together. Tim is so grateful for all her work and preparation for this.

PSAT will be shorter because it is digital - 2 hr 10 mins. The day still goes to 12:55. Will have two lunch shifts. All is posted on Schoology. The freshman will not be in school. There is a link on Naviance to work from at home. Career and post secondary information is available for freshman and a "how to" use x2VOL. Buses will depart 12:55.

Next week on the 19<sup>th</sup> will be the first SEL screener. You can go online to see the questions. The county is trying to assess where the kids are currently. Information retrieved from the screening will be used on two levels...the school level and the county level. They are looking to see if student engagement level is going up or down. Do the students feel like they have a

trusted adult in the building? Where might the lesson planning need to go from here? Counselors will have access to their students results and advisory teachers will have access to their students reports. They just look at it them and if there is a RED FLAG on a specific student then they may pull that student in to talk.

The end of the quarter is NOV 3. Which rolls into election day and a student holiday. The students current grades are a snap shot. Nothing is set in stone. No more are the days with quarter grades being in the past and moving on... now it is a rolling grade book. Everything will still be available to the students to demonstrate they know the content.

The end of Nov is wellness screening. SOS program (signs of suicide). 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> graders will be screened thru PE. If they do not have a PE class then it will be done through their counselor. 11<sup>th</sup> graders through their advisory classes.

Tomorrow is a regular start time.

"Hoco" was a huge success. We had just under 1300 tickets sold.
