THE PSAT's are here. From last year's scores, 9 national merit awards and 40 students are commended. 40 is the second highest we have had.

Mastery Transcript: Mrs. Blankenship, English teacher and Sajid Islam, Junior student

The Madison Wings Program is a 9-12 curation, reflection and presentation of path of their growth.

The Mastery Transcript Consortium is available Junior Year. It is a national and global nonprofit membership org that helps mastery of learning. Competency-based education available to all learners. Students create the Mastery transcript or learning record w evidence of competency in core content and life skills that is shared with colleges and employers.

Mad Wings celebrating student's growth and development in course and interdisciplinary competencies.

The Juniors last year compiled the components for competency. The history at Madison for this Education process is:

2021-2023 Approval Process, Spring 2023 Students created competency components, Fall 2023 @ 15 students send MLR's, Spring 2024 Student Present re: MTC, June 2024 Students revise Competency components, Fall 2024 Invite Juniors to Start MLR @ 18 Seniors send MTLR's and students present at Aurora, June 5 2025 Juniors to present at MLR's.

More colleges are accepting a mastery transcript learner record. This is in addition to a student's regular transcript. Students will add these elements to their common app.

Madison is a leader in the country. We present and collaborate with the Aurora Institute.

We offer because being able to give evidence of your skills is a game changer for both schools and employment opportunities.

Sajid thought it was helpful to be able to add a specific essay from one of his projects as well as one of the projects he and some classmates compiled to teach some younger kids coding. He felt it spotlighted some strengths and highlights that otherwise would not stand out on a transcript.

June 5th this year parents will be invited to hear student presentations for Juniors. Currently 90 Juniors signed up.

This will all stay Wings but can add to it with MTC if chose.
